Academic Information

Course requirement & ECTS

- ▶ A semester is composed of **30 ECTS** and an academic year of **60 ECTS**.
- ▶ In certain exchange programs outside of the Double Degrees, students could be allowed to follow fewer ECTS (with previous authorization of home university) **but no fewer than 25 ECTS**.
- ▶ Courses cannot be mixed and matched between programs.
- ▶ Grenoble Ecole de Management reserves the right to modify courses in the interest of academic development.



Timetable

- ▶ Please note that the organization of the semester and of the academic year can differ from your home university.
- ▶ At GEM, you will have about **25-30 hours of class during the week**. The timetable is planned for one semester, but some changes can occur during the semester.
- ▶ A course can take place during the whole semester as well as for one month only, even if the final exam is at the end of the semester.

French as a Foreign Language (FLE)

- ▶ All our English exchange programs include a compulsory "French as Foreign Language" (FLE) module.
- ▶ A placement test will be carried out upon arrival to set up the group levels (complete beginners are welcome).
- ▶ If the home university does not recognize the French course, students will be able to choose alternative business modules.

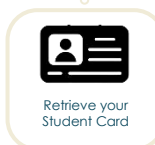
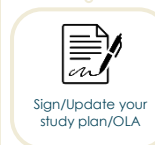

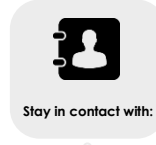

Housing

Once the accommodation is booked through the student platform, students can request a **housing certificate necessary for the visa application** to the residence. **GEM cannot provide you with this.**

Visa

Visa applications can take **up to 3 months**; students need to start this process as soon as they receive the acceptance letter. We recommend the students to **consult the official French [visa wizard](#)** to help them know if they need a visa to come and to which **consulate submit the application**.

It is also advisable to contact the local [Campus France](#) agency for guidance.
